



This International Nurses & Midwives Days, Keep the Nightingale Spirit Alive

We are all passing through tough times. With lockdowns imposed in some States and many to follow, the threat of Covid pandemic continues to threaten the entire world, especially India, as the current second phase is spreading at faster pace with greater virulence. Worse, unlike in phase 1 last year, the novel strains are not sparing children and young generation. Although government at central and state levels are working hard to contain the transmission of the pandemic, find appropriate care for the affected and arrange mass vaccination, but the size of the problem being enormous, it is indeed a formidable challenge. The manpower and logistics including hospitals being insufficient to cope up with this unexpected crisis, several institutions and hotels have been temporarily converted into Covid Care Centres. The Indian health care system, already deficient in health care workers including nurses and diagnostic facilities continues to be overstrained beyond capacity.

As usual, the TNAI has been contributing to mitigating the sufferings of those affected with dreaded Covid. To supplement the nursing workforce, the Government had decided to deploy the final year GNM, BSc and MSc Nursing students from schools and colleges of nursing. In this context, considering the well being and economic interest of young nurse students, the TNAI submitted an elaborate charter of guidelines to be observed.

The Covid wave 1 and wave 2 this year has clear messages for nursing administrators and planners. An imperative for preparedness is availability of nurses to meet the health emergencies like the current one. Not only nursing vacancies need to be duly filled up but also a reserved pool to swing to action, is the need of the hour.

Given the lingering threat of Covid and the protocols we must follow for the second year in row, we are missing the grand celebrations with huge gathering to observe the International Nurses Day on 12 May, the most awaited opportunity to remember and pay homage to the doyen of modern nursing, Sr Florence Nightingale, who laid the benchmarks for the nursing practice. Corona times warrant abiding by the Dos and Don'ts

to minimise the spread of Covid pandemic. More involved with bringing relief to the suffering in the events of health calamities by closely helping the sick than any other category of health professionals, a great challenge confronts nurses today; they continue to grapple with those affected with the Covid on an unprecedented scale. In keeping with the noble spirit to serve with unstinted dedication that Florence Nightingale ever preached and practiced, Nurses in particular have been putting in more than 8 hours in Covid duties to manage the cases. In the process, many nurses and other health care workers succumbed.

Not all days are alike. Believing that the situation shall take a pleasant turn, I wish all of you a Happy Nurses Day and Happy Midwives Day!

Guidelines for deploying student Nurses in Covid facilities

1	Deployment: Uniformity in deployment The Student nurses appointed shall be from the: i) Final year batch students of GNM and BSc, ii) First and Second year students of PB BSc and MSc. <i>Note: The students with comorbidities shall be excluded for this deployment.</i>
2	Vaccination The student nurses deployed shall receive the free Covid vaccination before deployment. Those who have completed two doses of Covid vaccine can be posted in Covid wards; others can be retained in the non-Covid area facilities of the hospital.
3	Personal Protective Equipment The student nurses deployed must be provided complete PPE during the time of duties in Covid facilities. <i>Principal of the particular nursing college shall ensure that students are provided complete PPE for students.</i>
4	Social security schemes The student nurses deployed shall be eligible for the PMGKP Insurance scheme of the MoHFW.
5	Working Hours The student nurses working hours shall be 6 hours including donning and doffing time.
6	Working Days per week Number of working days: 5 days per week (2 days off/ week).
7	Accommodation The student nurses' accommodation shall be arranged inside the hospital premises or adjacent facilities. The nurses deployed shall be provided decent, clean, hygienic, well-furnished, single accommodation.
8	Quarantine facilities The following facilities needs to be available in the quarantine centres: i. The period of quarantine must be as per the state/ central government norms applicable from time to time. ii. Individual accommodation with wash room facilities. iii. Nutritious meals and hygienic ambience. iv. Free testing / treatment facilities during quarantine illness period.

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9	Food The student nurses shall be offered nutritious food at the duty area just after the duty. The 3-time meal facility/mess services must be provided at the hostel/accommodation area.
10	Transportation Transportation facilities shall be arranged if the accommodation facility is away from the working place
11	Nurse-to-patient ratio The nurse to patient ratio shall be: In General ward- 1:6 In General Ward with Covid positive patient on oxygen- 1:3 In ICU- 1:1
12	Pay and Risk Allowances: i. The student nurses shall be paid @ Rs. 1000/day for BSc Nursing and GNM students ii. Since Post-Basic B.Sc Nursing and M.Sc Nursing students are Registered Nurses, they should be given pay equivalent to that of Nursing Officers/ Staff Nurses. iii. This pay shall be uniform in all the states intending to deploy the student nurses for the Covid duties.
13	Supervision of the student nurses The student nurses shall work under the supervision of Nursing Officer or nursing faculty.
14	Certificate of appreciation/ experience The Student nurses deployed shall be given the certificate of appreciation and experience for working in Covid area. They shall be entitled for preference and/or grace marks in future Government employment.
15	Counting of clinical experience The number of hours of special duty during Covid pandemic shall be considered along with the clinical experience for the course
16	Up-skilling The student nurses shall be updated with new Covid treatment guidelines time to time.

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बच्चों को स्वावलंबी होना सिखाएं

अनेक मातापिता लाड़ में बच्चों को अधिकाधिक सुविधाएं देने से बाज नहीं आते। कुछ की सोच होती है कि जिन शौकों से वे बचपन में स्वयं वंचित रहे, उन चीजों के लिए उनके बच्चे लिए न तरसें। ऐसे मातापिता बच्चों में गलत आदतें विकसित करते हैं। वे नहीं जानते कि बच्चे के समुचित विकास के लिए उसे दुनिया से रूबरू होना आवश्यक है।

अपनी शिक्षा, नौकरी, कार्य का स्वरूप, कंपनी का कार्यक्षेत्र के बाबत बच्चा बेहतर जानता है। और जब प्रश्न बच्चे से पूछे जाएं और उत्तर मातापिता दें तो बच्चे का विकास अधूरा रहना स्वाभाविक है। बच्चों को अपने कार्य स्वयं करने और खुलने के अवसर नहीं देंगे तो वे प्रौढ़ होने पर पराश्रित रहेंगे। अमेरिकी लेखक एलबर्ट हर्बार्ड कहते हैं, "जिन बच्चों के लिए मातापिता बहुत कुछ करते, और छोड़ कर जाते हैं, वे अपने लिए स्वयं कुछ ठोस नहीं करेंगे।" बच्चों को योग्य और समर्थ बनाने के लिए पशु-पक्षियों से सीखा जा सकता है। मादा जिराफ अपनी नवजात संतान को पहली बार तनिक ऊंचाई से, दूसरी-तीसरी बार और अधिक ऊंचाई से नीचे पटकती है। इस प्रक्रिया से गुजर कर नन्हा जिराफ सुघड़, दृढ़ और आत्मविश्वासी बनता है। पैरेंटिंग का 'हेलिकॉप्टर' मॉडल अपनाते मातापिता बच्चे का गला खराब होने पर डाक्टर से कहते सुने गए हैं, "मेरा ही गला देख लीजिए, मुझे बता दीजिए, मैं उसे सब समझा दूंगा"।

पौधे की इष्टतम संवृद्धि के लिए दूसरे पौधे से एक निर्दिष्ट दूरी आवश्यक है, बड़े पेड़ की छांव से भी बचाना होगा, उसे फलने-फूलने के लिए उचित पोषण और पर्याप्त सौर्य प्रकाश जो चाहिए। इसी तर्ज पर मनुष्य को बेहतर परवरिश और विकास के लिए कमोबेश उन्मुक्त, अबाधित वातावरण चाहिए। शैशव काल में विरासत में मिले संस्कारों के बाबत हम विवश होते हैं किंतु उम्र बढ़ने पर सुधी व्यक्ति विवेकपूर्ण पुनरीक्षा से अवांछित, नकारात्मक और अधोगामी पैत्रिक मूल्यों को तिलांजलि देने में समर्थ होता है। 'मुझे घर-परिवार में अनुकूल वातावरण नहीं मिला', यह दलील अपनी वर्तमान क्षमता को कमतर आंकने वाले की होती है। जीवन को सार्थक बनाने में अनुवांशिक संस्कारों से अधिक महत्व स्वनिर्मित संस्कारों का है। तीसरे संस्कार वे मुखौटे हैं जिन्हें हम लोक मर्यादा की अनुपालना में ओढ़ लेते हैं। शिष्टता, औपचारिकताओं और मर्यादाओं के आवरण में जीते व्यक्ति को अपने असल, दिव्य स्वरूप की मौजूदगी का अहसास नहीं रहता। इन तीनों संस्कारों की निष्पक्ष पड़ताल और अवांछित संस्कार निराकृत करने से ही सन्मार्ग का पथ प्रशस्त होगा।

बच्चे की जीवनरक्षक नौका बन कर उन्हें बचाने वाले अभिभावक बच्चे को निर्बल और पराश्रित बनाते हैं। जरूरत एक प्रकाशस्तंभ बन कर उसे स्वयं किनारे लगने का रास्ता सुझाने की है। तभी बच्चे की प्रगति की राह सुकर होगी।
