very year, the highest awards in nursing field viz. National Florence Nightingale Awards are conferred by President on select individuals having made extraordinary contribution to Nursing. As the apex organisation of Indian nurses, TNAI customarily felicitates these exemplary nurses who discharged particularly duties in Covid era. To this end, a virtual programme was conducted by TNAI in the afternoon of 25 September 2021. This was preceded by a meeting with press addressed by Prof (Dr) Roy K George, National President, National Vice Presidents, Secretary-General TNAI to keep the media persons posted with updates on Nursing in general and TNAI in particular. In his brief, he especially referred to the recently released 16th (reprint) edition of its Community Health Nursing Manual and continuing its programmes and other activities despite Corona making use of its heavy duty e-platform already in place that has capacity to cover 3,000 participants in one go.

A Day for the Oldsters: Organised every year on 1 October, International Day for Older Persons (IDOP) is a UN-sponsored observance in recognition of the long years of the elderly in service of the society and the world. The WHO has been playing a significant role in celebrations, and actively promoting public awareness of the day. This year is theme of IDOP is, Digital Equity for All Ages Better medical and health care facilities have tended to increase longevity so that the proportion of elderly population is growing in most countries, in some surpassing the youth population. From the current level of around 700 million 60+ people presently, this number is predicted to rise to 2 billion by 2050. A lot of attention is therefore imperative. Many of the elderly have expertise, special skills and knowhow that can be profitably used by the society. Their involvement in mainstream activities shall also help them from loneliness, a common problem with the aged.

Mental Health: A Formidable Issue to be Handled: We are often unmindful that mental aspect is not less crucial in making of sound health with the result that mental morbidities continue to rise at alarmingly high rate. World Mental Health Day, observed annually on 10 October seeks to raise awareness of mental health

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issues around the world and mobilise activities to combat the problems of mental health. The 2021 theme of World Mental Health Day is, Mental Health in an Unequal World Since March last year, Covid-19 and its implications wrought havoc on the mental health of entire global population in significant ways. The good sign is, after the World Health Assembly in May 2021, governments from around the world recognized the need to scale up quality mental health services at all levels, and some countries have found new ways of providing mental health care to their populations. The coronovirus has had its positive side too; many learnt to do away with the non-essential goods and services, the life style that can help us lead a more meaningful and satisfying life.



President Kovind Presents National Florence Nightingale Awards For Nursing Personnel

The milestone of vaccinating one crore-plus people in a single day in India was possible only because of dedication and untiring efforts of Nursing Personnel, said the President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind. He was speaking on the occasion of presentation of the National Florence Nightingale Awards to the Nursing Personnel at a virtual ceremony today (September 15, 2021).

The President said that it was the unrelenting support provided by the nurses, which has helped us in fighting the Covid-19 pandemic. It is only because of their sustained efforts that we have achieved the dis-



tinction of vaccinating a sizeable portion of our population. The milestone of vaccinating one crore-plus people in a single day in India was possible only because of their dedication and untiring efforts.

The President said that many of our nurses have lost their lives in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic. He noted that one of the awardees lost her life while treating COV-ID-19 patients. He said that for this sacrifice, the nation would always be indebted to her. He stated that the services and sacrifices cannot be evaluated in terms of any pecuniary benefit. Still, the government has acknowledged the contribution of nurses during the pandemic and has launched ₱radhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Package (PMGKP): Insurance Scheme for Health Workers Fighting COVID-19 to provide a comprehensive personal accident cover of Rs. 50 lakh to all healthcare providers.

Pointing to the theme for the International Nurses Day 2021, Nurses: A Voice to Lead \square A vision for future healthcare, the President said that it brings out the central role of nurses in healthcare delivery systems worldwide. Nursing indeed plays a crucial role in addressing multiple health challenges and responding to the health needs of individuals, communities and society. Nurses and midwives are often the first point of contact between the people and the health system. Nurses and midwives not only contribute to meeting the health-related Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) targets, but also towards education, gender sensitisation and economic growth of the nation. They play a fundamental role in the healthcare delivery system and are critical to our healthcare delivery.

The President noted that nurses in our country are adapting themselves for innovative and challenging roles. He said that now, those who engage in nursing can develop specific skills and competencies. The government has launched the Midwifery Service Initiative to create a new cadre of midwives. They would be called Nurse Practitioner Midwife (NPM) who would be equipped with the requisite knowledge and competencies. With the help of this initiative, health services would be able to reach the women of the last rung of the society.

The President said that today award winners have set exemplary examples of service to the people. Sometimes even in the absence of basic transport facilities, they have provided medical facilities to the people. Some have even gone beyond the call of duty and provided services for social welfare like educating people against child marriages, providing assistance during natural disasters and extending the helping hand to the tribal community. He congratulated all the awardees and expressed hope that they would continue to heal the suffering people and enhance the prestige of this noble profession.
