Strengthening TNAI Plans for Superior Outcomes

The preceding month has been unusually eventful for TNAI. The 106th Meeting of EC/Council Committee was held face-to-face, the traditional way on 12-13 March 2022. Long looked after easing of Covid norms have certainly ushered in vibrancy and humane element in personal and social interactions.

The high level meeting paid tribute to the great souls of nursing fraternity who lost their lives in the battle against Covid-19. It took important decisions for the welfare of TNAI members. These included: Enhancement of Critical and Medical Illness grant from Rs one lakh to two lakh; Personal Accident Death Insurance of Rs 10 lakh; development of Mobile application for TNAI to keep members and nurses updated about the activities. This app will have the features of online enrolment to TNAI membership, TNAI Bulletin and NJI, facility to update contact details, and many more features. It was decided to celebrate 'Foundation day' on 16 June every year and felicitate five nurses, one each from all five regions of TNAI with 'Nurse Excellence Awards'. Necessary guidelines on the same will be worked out soon.

For promoting research, the scheme of Research Grant for TNAI members is already in place, for the year 2021, nine grants were allowed. Research grant for 2022 will be shortly invited. To augment training, Skills Lab shall be established in four regions of TNAI. Other decisions include: sponsoring five nurses for Civil Service Examination coaching in New Delhi; sponsoring TNAI members for Faculty Development Programme; QR code for various fees and donation payment to TNAI to facilitate money transaction; legal action on 80:20 reservation by CIB of AIIMS.

It was also decided that the TNAI shall take up the issues of expedite the establishment of Nursing Directorate at National and State Levels, initiation of Nursing Cadre at national and state level institutions, travel concession for National Florence Nightingale Awardees in Indian Railways to the respective administrative levels.

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As for streamlining SNAI, the EC/Council recommended revision of SNAI bye laws to create more leadership positions for Student Nurses in SNAI. It was decided to provide MST nomination and uterine collection model to SNA units who who shift to (New) SNAI-TNAI Membership plan, and are paying continuously for last five years and three years respectively. Also, a Modular Skill Trainer Mannequin shall be provided by Laerdal to active SNAI Units.

Upcoming TNAI events: Standalone conference in 2022 to commemorate the year of Nurse and Midwives (2020); TNAI National Biennial Conference in February 2023.

HOD Meeting: It was decided to conduct the HOD Meeting of TNAI, long overdue, on 30 April 2022.

OBITUARY

Maj Gen Glena Albertina Saha, AVSM, VSM, former Chief Principal Matron (later designated as Additional Director-General, Military Nursing Service), left for heavenly abode on 7 March 2022 in Goa.

Born on 13 Nov 1925, the Officer had an illustrious professional career in Military Nursing Service (MNS). She held numerous clinical, administrative and staff appointments in various Armed Forces establishments. She was an excellent bed side nurse, able administrator and exemplary leader who performed her duties with utmost dedication and compassion. With sheer hard work and willingness to dedicate herself to the service, she assumed the highest appointment in MNS in the rank of Major General from 1 Jan 1983 to 30 Nov 1984. Her tenure as Chief Principal Matron witnessed the introduction and implementation of many innovative ideas in nursing practices and nursing education in MNS. In recognition of her distinguished and meritorious contribution to the service, she was awarded with Ati Vishisht Seva Medal (AVSM) and Vishist Seva Medal (VSM). Her immense contributions to the service will always remain enshrined in the annals of the Military Nursing Service.

Maj Gen Smita Devrani, Addl DGMNS and all officers of Military Nursing Service deeply grieve the demise of Maj Gen Glena Albertina Saha AVSM VSM and pray to God, the Almighty to give courage to the bereaved family to cope with the great loss.



Mrs Aleykutty Mani, the founder principal of College of Nursing, Armed Forces Medical College, Pune, left for heavenly abode on 19 Feb 2022 at Kochi, Kerala.

Born in 1920, Mrs Aleykutty Mani, a renowned nurse educator began her career at RAK College of Nursing, Delhi in 1944 as a Clinical Instructor. Being in Delhi during the pre-independent era of struggles, she had the opportunity to participate in various freedom movements at that time. With quest for updating her professional knowledge and skills, she pursued graduation in nursing from Syracuse University, New York with a scholarship from Rockefeller Foundation during 1951-1953. Later, she completed her post graduation from Wayne State University, Michigan (1961-1963) on another scholarship by the Agency of International Development. On return, she joined Rajkumari Amrit Kaur (RAK) College of Nursing, Delhi as the Vice Principal.

While working in RAK College of Nursing, Delhi, she was selected to be the founder principal of the prestigious College of Nursing, Armed Forces Medical College, Pune in 1964 initially on deputation for three years and continued to be the Principal till her retirement in 1981. Her immense contribution as principal, College of Nursing AFMC, Pune has profoundly impacted generations of MNS officers.

She is survived by her daughter Mrs Elizabeth Mani, her son-law, Asst Cmdt Anand Kumar (Retd) and her two grandsons. Maj Gen Smita Devrani, Addl DGMNS and all officers of MNS offer heartfelt condolences to the family and pray to God Almighty to bless and grant eternal peace to the departed soul and strength to the bereaved family to bear the irreparable loss.

The 29th SNAI Biennial (Virtual) Conference: A Report

The SNAI Biennial Conference is being conducted every two years since 1961. The last conference was scheduled for 2021. However, since it was not possible to conduct the same the traditional (physical) way due to the lingering Coronavirus, the TNAI EC/Council (Minute No. TNAI/TCAC/Zoom/8 June, 2021/2) decided to conduct SNAI Conference virtually to keep the SNA members' momentum.

Accordingly, the 29th Biennial Conference was held during 21-22 January 2022 virtually. It was hosted by TNAI Headquarters. A wide variety of activities, as per the objectives of the Association, were encouraged at all levels for the SNAI members. These activities seek to develop the professional, educational and cultural aspects of students irrespective of region, State or institution. Besides academic aspects, these activities seek to promote co-curricular components of the students for their holistic development. The Conference brought together student nurses, nurse educators, administrators, clinical experts and research scholars of various specialities under one national virtual platform. A total of 65,000 student nurses from 33 States/ Union Territories got registered for the Conference.

Brief Outline of the 2-Day Programme

Inaugural Session: It started with the invocation song by the nursing students from various nursing institutions of Greater Noida (UP) followed by ceremonial virtual lamp lighting. Mrs Evelyn P Kannan, Secretary-General, TNAI welcomed the august gathering (virtually) and presented updates on TNAI and SNAI. Prof (Dr) Roy K George, National President TNAI, delivered presidential address and a motivational speech for the student nurses across the country.

Messages from Dignitaries: It was immense pleasure and honour for TNAI to have received inspirational and encouraging messages from top leaders, bureaucrats and representatives of international bodies: Hon'ble Vice-President Shri M Venkaiah Naidu; Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi; Secretary Health & Family Welfare Shri Rajesh Bhushan; President INC Dr T Dileep Kumar; Chief Nursing Officer WHO Ms Elizabeth Iro; President CNMF Ms Kathleen McCourt and Chief Executive Secretary CNMF Ms Jill Iliffe.

Launch of WHO SAVER (Safe Abortion Values Evidence and Rights) Game

It was very delighted to witness, first of its kind, the launch of WHO Safe Abortion Values, Evidence & Rights (SAVER) Games by Dr Pushpa Choudhary DEO, Team Lead, RMNCH WHO India and Dr Priya Karna, Technical Officer, Reproductive Health, WHO India who demonstrated how to play the SAVER games. During the Conference, poll questions were asked regarding the SAVER game. Nearly 74 percent of participants expressed their willingness to play the game. The SAVER game, believed to enlighten the Student Nurses and the Nurses about the safe abortion to bring down incidence of unsafe abortion. The game and the modules on SAVER, will be soon uploaded in the TNAI's E-Learning Management System (LMS) for the benefit of more nurses and student nurses. The liveliness and vibrancy of the Game attracted the students and other participants, who relished it to the end full-heartedly.

E-Scientific Paper

The theme of the scientific paper, Prevalence of COVID-Appropriate Behaviour among General Public was notified and published in advance in past issues of TNAI Bulletin and Nursing Journal of India and such circular was also sent to all the Presidents, Secretaries and State SNAI Advisors of the TNAI State branches as well as to all the nursing institutions. In all 14 Scientific papers received from as many States were selected after evaluation by a panel of three judges at the national level.

Best three papers were selected. Mrs. Swapna Joshi, Vice President, West Region moderated the this session. The selected papers were presented during the conference by: Ms Aastha Negi, College of Nursing, Army Hospital (R&R), Delhi; Ms Divya Sreedharan, St John's College of Nursing, St John's National Academy of Health Sciences, Bengaluru (Karnataka); and Ms Athira Rajan, Ms Alphonsa Sabu, Ms Aleena Baby from Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church (MOSC) College of Nursing, Ernakulum (Kerala). These papers dwelt on observing Covid-appropriate behaviour imperative in the current 3rd phase of the pandemic.

E-Poster Competition

We received 168 E-posters from 21 states for each of 11 sections on as many topics. Out of these, one entry from each of 11 sections was selected. Here also, first winner of each section (State) was allowed to compete at the national level. After the evaluation by the judges first three winners and consolation prizes were awarded for each section at the national level. These posters not only brought out the real learning experience of the participants but were also appreciated by others for the ethos being conveyed.

Online Quiz Competition

In the Quiz competition category there were 19 winners at the national level from amongst those who earlier competed at State level from 19 States for the online quiz competition. The quiz was conducted by Mr Biju Velayudhan, Chief Information Officer, GKNM Hospital Coimbatore (TN). This thrilling session was highly appreciated by one & all. During the 2-day conference, seven questions were asked. The same [with answers] are follows: (1) First Indian President of the TNAI Trained Nurses' Association of India [Ms TK Adranvala]; (2) Year of commencement of Nursing Journal of India [1910]; (3) Name of New Nursing Regulatory Bill pending with parliament for approval [National Nursing and Midwifery Commission (NNMC) Bill]; (4) First Health Minister of Independent India [Smt Rajkumari Amrit Kaur] (5) Name of National President of the Trained Nurses' Association of India [Prof (Dr) Roy K George]; (6) Whether WHO SAVER Games was interesting - 74% said they will play the game, 68% said it was interesting; (7) Name of the President of Indian Nursing Council [Dr T. Dileep Kumar].

E-Concept Mapping

The theme of the Concept mapping was 'SNA members to TNAI National President'. A total of 19 concept maps were received from as many States. At the national level, awards were given to first three winners; Consolation prizes were also awarded.

Prize Distribution

The National President TNAI and the National Vice Presidents presented the memento (virtually) and congratulated the winners of competitions of all categories and appreciated their efforts. A certificate and a memento will be sent to all the winners to the respective institutions. We also applaud the Principals, teachers and Unit SNA Advisors for being the driving force motivating and encouraging the students to participate in SNA activities.

Presidential Chain

Mrs Evelyn P Kannan, the Secretary-General outlined the history of TNAI's ceremonial chain. The First Presidential chain for the TNAI was donated by Miss Diana Hartley, the First General Secretary of TNAI. Her name is engraved on the golden pendant of the Chain. The name of each successive President with the tenure is engraved on the golden coin attached in the chain. The chain is handed over to the new National President by the outgoing National President with the handing of the charge. During all the professional gatherings i.e. TNAI Conference, SNAI Conference, Meetings of the Executive/ Council and House of Delegates, the Secretary-General honours the National President with the ceremonial chain before commencement of the meetings and conferences. This time also the Secretary General honoured the National President TNAI with the Presidential Chain virtually.

Plenary Session

The plenary session was chaired by Prof (Dr) Roy K George, the National President TNAI. In his address, he expressed satisfaction to note the enormous presence (65,000) of participants both in online mode and YouTube representing numerous Nursing institutions across the country. "It is really a pleasure to watch so many SNA members participating in various activities", he said. He added, "We are trained to be tough in dealing with crisis situations and proved it once again during the pandemic as also in successfully conducting this conference. The credit and congratulations go to all the SNA members around the country. He said having been personally enriched and recharged with the experiences shared by the participants in the conference. Prof George exhorted the student nurses to take utmost interest in improving their skills, work with dedication and prepare themselves to take on the future positions in nursing awaiting them. He advised students to take up small leadership position and to become active TNAI members in future who will contribute to a emergence of a brighter, healthier and dignified profession that nursing is.

National SNAI Biennial Report

Mrs Vatchala Dhinakaran, the Assistant Secretary-General presented the National SNAI Biennial Report containing the SNAI membership status, national SNAI subscription plans, benefits of acquiring SNAI membership, introduction of SNAI badge, SNAI Whatsapp number and upskilling of nursing students on Covid-19 through e-learning. This report is finalised at Hqrs after compiling & collating the inputs about the activities undertaken at SNA Unit levels under various State Branches.



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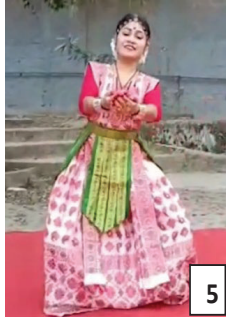
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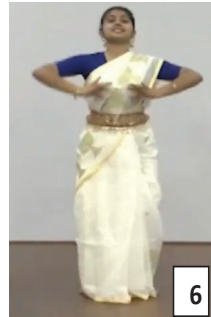
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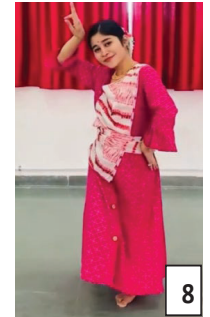
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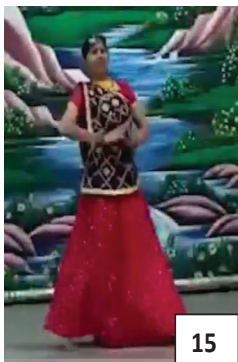
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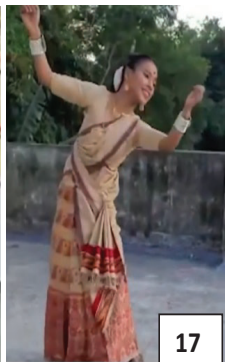
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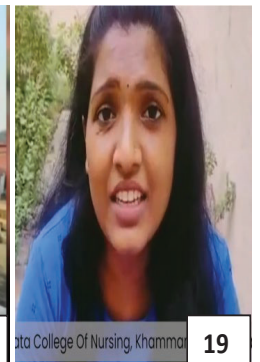
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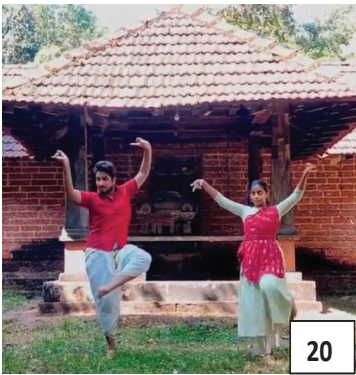
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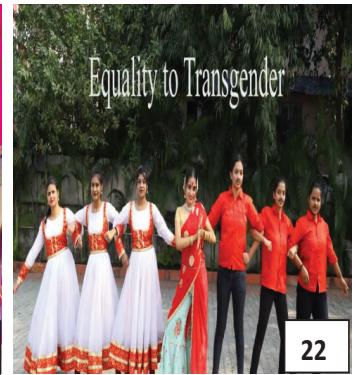
