The last date of receipt of applications is 30 October 2022. Details about submission of entries have been given in September 2022 issue of TNAI Bulletin.

A recent initiative of TNAI towards facilitating them in career advancement has been (after the decision of National EC/ Council) to this effect) incentive to Indian Civil Services aspiratnts. The selected members shall be eligible for free accommodation in TNAI Guest House, New Delhi and part-funding of coaching fee for duration up to 6 months.

हल्के में नहीं लें हृदय रोग को

कभी हृदय रोग उम्रदारों या कुलीन वर्ग को होते थे। किंतु पिछले कुछ दशकों के ट्रेंड से पता चलता है कि निम्नवर्ग तथा कम आयु के लोग भी इससे अछूते नहीं हैं। भारतीय युवाओं में हृदय संबंधी बीमारियों के मामले तेजी से बढ़ रहे हैं। विश्व स्वास्थ्य संगठन (डब्ल्यूएचओ) के अनुसार हृदय रोग हमारे देश में महामारी का रूप ले चुका है, और यह करीब एक तिहाई मौतों के लिए जिम्मेदार है।

हृदय की भूमिकाः मांसपेशियों से निर्मित हृदय समूचे शरीर के लिए पंप का कार्य करता है। यह निर्बाध रूप से सदा चलते रहता है तािक पूरे शरीर में रक्त का संचार होता रहे। हृदय की रक्त वािहिनयों (कोरोनरी आर्टरी) में जब अवरोध ७० प्रतिशत या उससे ज्यादा हो जाता है तो हृदय की मांसपेशियों को उचित मात्रा में रक्त नहीं पहुंचता और रोगी को तकलीफ होने लगती है।

हृदय के स्वास्थ्य के बाबत जागरूकता बढ़ाने की दृष्टि से विश्व हृदय दिवस प्रति वर्ष २६ सितंबर को मनाया जाता है। विभिन्न माध्यमों से प्रयास किए जाते हैं कि हम अपने हृदय के स्वास्थ्य के प्रति सचेत रहें। दुर्भाग्यपूर्ण है कि भारत में हर साल लगभग 9२ लाख युवा कार्डियक अरेस्ट से दम तोड़ देते हैं।.

जब हृदय की मांसपेशियों को रक्त प्रवाहित करने वाली किसी भी आरटरी में अचानक 900 प्रतिशत की रुकावट आ जाए तो उन मांसपेशियों को पोशण नहीं मिलता तथा उनकी कोशिकाएं मरने लगती हैं और व्यक्ति रोगग्रस्त हो जाता है। बहुत से रोगियों में हार्टअटैक के समय हृदय की धड़कन अनियमित हो जाती है जिसके कारण अचानक मृत्यु हो जाती है। हृदय में दर्द होना बीमारी का प्रमुख लक्षण है। शरीर को कम मात्रा में रक्त मिलने से किसी भी अंग में तकलीफ हो सकती है। तेज भितरी दर्द, भारीपन; कसावट, घुटन सी महसूस होना; जलन महसूस होना; अपचन जैसा लगना; सीने के बीचों-बीच या बाएं सीने में कष्ट जैसे लक्षणों की अनदेखी जोखिम में डाल सकती है। बीस मिनट से ज्यादा दर्द हार्ट अटैक के कारण हो सकता है। डायबिटीज (शुगर); ब्लड प्रेशर; तम्बाकू का सेवन, श्रम या व्यायाम न करना, कोलेस्ट्रहल-बहुल भोजन का सेवन दिल के रोगों का कारण बन सकते हैं।


