 - The scientific study submitted for consideration as scientific paper presentation shall follow IMRAD format (Introduction, Methodology, Results and Discussion).
 - Please note that (1) the study carried out within last **four years** period only shall be entertained, and (2) the researcher/ presenter shall be a member of TNAI.
 - The word limit for the scientific paper presentation is **2000-2500**. Enclose separate sheet with author/authors name and a brief bio data, complete address, phone number, email, and TNAI number.

iii) Poster Presentation (based on Scientific Paper)

All posters should be based on Research papers like a visual presentation of the scientific paper on any nursing specialty by individual TNAI member for display.

- a) Size: Size of the Poster/ Flex should be approximately 30 x 40 inches.
- b) **Lettering**: Lettering and design of the poster should be bold and big enough to be seen from a distance.
- c) **Layout**: Layout of the picture, if any, must be properly balanced to give a correct sense of proportion.

Note

(1) Ideas depicted in the poster should be relevant to the study. (2) Extra fixing of clipping/cuttings or any other form on the poster should be avoided. (3) The scientific study submitted for poster presentation shall follow IMRAD format (Introduction, Methodology, Results and Discussion). (4) All the presenters (Conference theme, Concurrent Session and Poster Presentation) should register for the conference. No TA DA will be provided to the presenters. (5) The TNAI will be awarding certificate along with 16 credit hours purely based on registration and attendance. (6) The research paper will be published in any of the forthcoming issues of the NJI after the conference.

HEALTH EVENTS OF THE MONTH

World Diabetes Day: 14 November

Even after 100 years of the discovery of insulin – the master drug to control diabetes – millions of people with diabetes the world over are unable to access the care they need. People with diabetes require ongoing care and support to manage their condition and avoid complications. To compound the scenario, half the patients with diabetes remain undetected. It is to raise awareness about prevention and treatment of diabetes that World Diabetes Day is observed worldwide annually on 14 November. The World Health Organisation (WHO), the International Diabetes Foundation (IDF) and others conduct activities for educating the public on ways and means to curb the menace of diabetes.

Traditionally considered as the disease of the affluent class, it has spread to all sections of society. By 2035, around 592 million people are estimated to die of diabetes. The aetiology of diabetes (type 1 or type 2) remains unclear though obesity, sedentary life style and lack of physical exercise have been found as predisposing factors. Common symptoms are: Feeling unusually thirsty or hungry, weak and tired; irritability, mood swings; frequent urination, presence of ketones in the urine; loss of weight; blurry vision; delayed healing of sores & wounds; getting gum, skin, vaginal or other infections.

Prolonged diabetes can be disabling or even life-threatening. General complications include: heart and blood vessel disease, damage to kidney or nerve (nephropathy/ neuropathy), diseases of heart and blood vessel or foot, susceptibility to mouth and skin condition, hearing impairment, Alzheimer's disease and depression. The theme for World Diabetes Day 2022 is, "Education to Protect Tomorrow". The underlying assumption is, if remained undiagnosed, one can land in serious complications. World Diabetes Day is celebrated in 170 countries through diabetes associations.

National Newborn Week: 15-21 November

The neonatal period i.e. the first 28 days of life is most crucial period for survival of child as well as its optimum growth. However, more than 2.6 million babies lose their life during this first 28-day period, most of them in the first week and additional 2.6 million stillbirths occur each year. To draw attention of health care professionals and lay public, Newborn Care Week is celebrated every year in the country from 15 to 21 November. The physical and emotional consequences of childbirth – from injuries to recurring pain and trauma - can be debilitating if unmanaged befittingly. "The need for quality maternity and newborn care does not stop once a baby is born," says Dr Anshu Banerjee, Director of Maternal, Newborn, Child and Adolescent Health and Ageing at WHO.

Considering the seminal role of newborn's health, Government of India had earlier launched Mission Indradhanush so that each child born is covered under all necessary vaccinations. Eventually, the after PMO undertook monitoring of recommended immunisations for each and every infant with instructions to track all the children. Consequently, significant improvement in has been witnessed in survival of New Born and better health of the child.

Maj Gen (Miss) VMM Game (Retd)

Maj Gen (Miss) VMM Game (Retd), AVSM, VSM, former Additional Director-General (ADG) Military Nursing Service (MNS), left for heavenly abode on 8 October 2022 at Command Hospital (Southern Command) Pune.

Born on 16 April 1935 in Patna (Bihar), she joined MNS when commissioned as Lieutenant in 1956. A highly dedicated, meticulous, enthusiastic and energetic professional with great compassion, care and skill, she rendered yeomen services in active war time in Indo-China War (1962) and in Indo-Pak War (1971) and saved several wounded soldiers. She did her specialisation in Operation Theatre Nursing, and was awarded a scholarship under



Colombo plan scheme to specialise in Orthopaedic Nursing at the New South Wales College of Nursing in Sydney, Australia.

In her long meritorious career the General Officer held various prestigious positions including that of ADGMNS (January 1992 to April 1994) during which period many reforms with impact on the generations of MNS officers were witnessed. For her distinguished service of exceptional order during war and peace, she was awarded the Chief of Army Staff Commendation in 1971, the Vishist Seva Medal in 1982 and the Ati Vishisht Seva Medal in 1994. साफ-सफाई रहेगी तो फिजाएं और सेहत दोनों सही रहेंगे

कहावत है, स्वच्छता में देवत्व का वास होता है। दूसरे शब्दों में, यदि हमें प्रभु की कृपा का भागी बनना है तो हमें स्वच्छता का ध्यान रखना होगा। वैसे भी, अपने परिवेश की और स्वयं साफ-सफाई रखेंगे तो हमारे दिलोदिमाग में पाजिटिव, प्रगतिशील विचार आएंगे और टिकेंगे। साफ-सफाई के बाह्य पक्षों में शौचालयों की विशिष्ट भूमिका है।

एक समय था जब शौचालय या इससे संबंधित किसी विषय पर चर्चा करना गैरजरूरी और अशिष्ट समझा जाता था। पचास-साठ वर्ष पहले की याद करें। छोटे शहरों या कस्बों में शौचालय मकान के उपेक्षित पिछवाड़े में होता था। अन्य जगमगाते कमरों की तुलना में कच्चे-पक्के शौचालय में न तो उचित रोशनी होती, न ही कायदे की सफाई। कहीं तो शौचालय में पानी की किल्लत होती।

संप्रति समुचा विश्व साफ-सफाई के बारे में संक्रमण काल से गुजर रहा है। लगभग ३.६ अरब लोग घटिया कोटि के शौच. ालयों से गुजर-बसर कर रहे हैं। इसके अतिरिक्त ६७.३ करोड़ व्यक्ति खुले में शौच निबटते हैं। शौचालयों के खस्ता हालत से इन्हें इस्तेमाल करने वाले प्रायः विभिन्न बीमारियों के जोखिम में रहते हैं। आमजन को शौचालय और समृचित शौच प्रथाओं के बाबत शिक्षित करने की दृष्टि से संयुक्त राष्ट्र के तत्वाधान में जैक सिम नामक व्यक्ति ने १६ नवंबर २००१ को विश्व शौचालय संगठन की शुरुआत की। तब से इस तारीख विश्व शौचालय संगठन दिवस मनाई जाती है। उद्देश्य यह था कि स्वच्छता के संदेश को ले कर शौचालय के उपयोग को बढ़ाया जाए तथा खुले में शौच की परिपाटी को उत्तरोत्तर खत्म किया जाए। वर्ष २०२२ के शौचालय दिवस का थीम है, जिसे जानबूझ कर ढ़क कर रखा गया है उसे सामने लाया जाए।

खुले में शौच का एक नुक्सान यह है कि मल तालाब, नदी जैसे जल संसासधनों में चला जाता है तथा अनेक बीमायों का कारण बनता है। स्पष्ट है, सफाई व्यवस्था दुरस्त कर दी जाए तो भूजल प्रदूषण पर अंकुश लगेगा। शौचालय दिवस का विज़न यह है कि प्रत्येक व्यक्ति को स्वच्छ प्रणाली से जुड़ा शौचालय उपलब्ध हो।

भारत में स्वच्छता के भाव संपुष्ट रखने के लिए २ अक्टूबर २०१४ को स्वच्छ भारत मिशन (ग्रामीण) और ख़ुले में शौच के समापन की शुरुआत की गई थी। इस मिशन के तहत ग्रामीण अंचलों में पक्के शौचालय बनवाने के लिए एकमुश्त राशि प्रदान की जाती है। योजना में स्कूलों को भी शामिल किया गया, महिला शौचालयों को खासकर ध्यान में रखा गया।

महिला सुरक्षा और शौचालय - घर में उचित शौचालय न होने का पक्ष महिला सुरक्षा से संबद्ध है। देखा गया है कि इस परिपाटी के चलते महिलाओं के प्रति दुर्व्यवहार के मामलों में बढ़त होती है और महिलाओं में असुरक्षा की भावना पनपती है। कार्यक्रम की सफलता इस सुखद परिणाम से झलकती है कि ग्राम्य स्कूलों में पांच वर्षों में शौचालययुक्त स्कूलों का प्रतिशत ४० से बढ़ कर लगभग सौ प्रतिशत हो गया।
