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सार्वजनीन स्वास्थ्य कवरेज क्यों, और कैसे

स्वास्थ्य मनुष्य की सबसे बड़ी पूंजी है। स्वस्थ रहेंगे तभी सभी कार्य बेहतर ढ़ंग से निष्पादित करने में समर्थ होंगे, और तभी परिजनों, समाज और राष्ट्र के विकास में योगदान दे सकेंगे। स्वस्थ रहने के लिए पहले तो स्वास्थ्य और पोषण का बुनियादी ज्ञान आवश्यक है। उसी के साथ यह भी ध्यान रहे कि अनेक व्यापक और संक्रामक बीमारियों से बचाव के लिए जरूरी दिशा-निर्देशों की अनुपालना की जाए।

देश के नागरिकों को नीरोग रखने के लिए जरूरी है कि उपलब्ध स्वास्थ्य सेवाएं और सुविधाएं सभी की पहुंच में हों। बहुत से विकासशील देशों का दुर्भाग्य है कि खासी संख्या में वहां के नागरिक इसलिए दम तोड़ देते हैं कि समय पर उन्हें स्वास्थ्य सुविधा पहुंचाई नहीं जा सकी। इसके अनेक कारण होते हैं। पहला स्वास्थ्य जागरूकता का अभाव; दूसरा, लक्षणों के आधार पर बीमारी की पहचान करने वाला नजदीक में नहीं था, या उससे संपर्क नहीं साधा जा सका। तीसरा जरूरी दवा या जांच सुविधा नजदीक में थी ही नहीं, थी भी तो रोगी के पास सुविधा प्राप्त करने के लिए पैसे नहीं थे।

बुनियादी तथा आवश्यक स्वास्थ्य सुविधाओं के अभाव में किसी की जान को जोखिम न हो, यह सुनिश्चित करने की दृष्टि से संयुक्त राष्ट्र प्रतिवर्ष १२ दिसंबर का दिन अंतर्राष्ट्रीय सार्वजनीन स्वास्थ्य कवरेज दिवस के रूप में मनाता है। वर्ष २०१२ में स्वीकृति के बाद संयुक्त राष्ट्र के तत्वाधान में, इस दिवस के कार्यक्रमों का उद्देश्य रहता है जिस किसी को जिस रूप में स्वास्थ्य सेवा की नितांत आवश्यकता हो वह उसे मुहैया कराई ही जानी चाहिए, वित्त के अभाव में उसके स्वास्थ्य से समझौता नहीं हो। प्रदान की जाने वाली सुविधाओं में रोकथाम, उपचार, पुनर्वास व स्वास्थ्य संवर्धन, सभी पक्ष सम्मिलित हैं। वर्ष २०२२ के लिए स्वास्थ्य कवरेज दिवस का थीम है, "सभी की आकांक्षाओं के अनुसार भविष्य का निर्माणः सभी स्वस्थ रहें।"

हालांकि २००० से २०१६ तक दो दशकों में वेस्टर्न पेसिफिक अंचल में हेल्थ सूचकांक में ४६ से ८० की बढ़त दर्ज की गई तथापि अनेक देशों में सेवाओं की कवरेज एकसार नहीं रही और जनसमुदायों को, विशेषकर संवेदनशील वर्गों को वित्तीय कठिनाइयों से जूझना पड़ा।

यह देखते हुए कि विश्व में आधी से अधिक लोगों को हेल्थ कवरेज सुलभ नहीं है, करीब 90 करोड़ व्यक्तियों के पास 'अत्यधिक गरीबी' के कारण स्वास्थ्य सेवा हासिल करने के लिए धन नहीं है, सदस्य राष्ट्रों की सरकारों से आह्वान किया गया है कि वे हेल्थ कवरेज के लिए वित्तीय साधन सृजित करें। आखिर, सभी स्वस्थ रहेंगे तभी विश्व समुदाय का कल्याण संभव होगा।
