Onsidering that breastfeeding can save the lives of about 8.23 lakh children under 5 years, and 20,000 mothers each year (translating to \$302 billion loss in economic terms annually), WHO and UNICEF recommend early initiation of breastfeeding within 1 hour of birth, exclusive breastfeeding for 6 initial months of life and feeding complementary (solid) foods at 6 months together with continued breastfeeding upto 2 years of age or beyond.

# Empowering the Future Education: Key Leaders Convene in Uttar Pradesh – A Comprehensive Report



The Trained Nurses' Association of India (TNAI) organised two Zonal meetings with principals and senior representatives of various Nursing institutions in UP to discuss the implementation of Mission Niramaya [Niramaya means free from disease] with focus on strengthening the nursing cadre in the State. The meeting was conducted jointly with Uttar Pradesh State Medical Faculty (UPSMF), Language Laboratories Private Limited (EBEK), and the Occupational English Test (OET) representatives.

The first one-day meeting for Zone I was held on 9 June 2023 at Samarpan Institute of Nursing and Paramedical Sciences (SINPS), Lucknow (UP), and second meeting for Zone II on 18 July 2023 at Subharti College of Nursing, Meerut (UP). Launched in October 2022, Mission Niramaya seeks to promote nursing and paramedical streams as attractive career option for students so that Uttar Pradesh emerges as a hub for global healthcare professionals.

- 1. Last date for receiving nomination is **18th September**, **2023** (6 weeks from the date of Publication)
- 2. The election venue, date and time will be informed to you well in advance.
- 3. Both the nominator as well as nominee shall be a life member of TNAI.
- 4. The members holding office positions in TNAI shall not hold office positions in parallel Nursing organisations and vice versa. For acquiring the new post the members will

- have to relinquish the former post.
- 5. A member working and residing in a state or Union Territory shall be the member of the branch of TNAI. In case of temporary change of resident e.g. study; deputation etc. for a period of more than a year, the member shall be given an option for changing his/her membership to the temporary place of resident after informing the headquarters and the former and latter state branches.
- 6. The nominator and nominee should be working and residing in the same state or Union Territory shall be eligible for contesting election and casting the vote.
- 7. The members who are residing outside the country and state shall not be eligible for contesting election.
- 8. Members who are or had been involved in litigation with the Association without first representing the grievances to the grievances committee shall not be eligible to contest and shall have no voting rights and same will be applicable to the members who are facing disciplinary proceedings in their work situation/sphere.
- 9. Outgoing office bearers who completed one term shall be eligible for re-election for one more term.
- 10. Any life member of TNAI may make nominations for all the offices of the TNAI State/ UT Branch, but the nomination for the President and Secretary shall be made only from those who have served for one term (four years) as the EC members/office bearers at any time.
- 11. A break of four years after two consecutive terms (8 years) is necessary for the President/Secretary of the branch.
- 12. For the offices of President and Secretary all valid nominations shall be included in the Provisional Ballot Paper. For other offices, the names of three members having highest number of nominations shall be included in the Ballot Paper.
- 13. The Chairperson of the Public Health Nursing Section, Nursing Service Section, Education Section and Representatives of Health Visitor's League (HVL)/ANM should be elected from their respective field only.
- 14. The nomination Sheet duly filled and completed by the nominator i.e. complete address, TNAI number along with the signature shall be sent to the Returning Officer within six weeks of its publication in the TNAI Bulletin.

### **Health Event of the Month**

#### **World Mosquito Day: 20 August**

World Mosquito Day is celebrated annually on 20 August mainly to recognise the efforts of Sir Ronald Ross. It was in 1897 that Sir Ronald Ross found a groundbreaking discovery that eventually led to the path-breaking connection between mosquitoes and Malaria. Sir Ronald Ross, a British army surgeon who worked in India, was conferred Nobel Prize in 1902 for his discovery. Before that, there was no clarity about the link between the two, and the deadly disease caused by them, the malaria vectors.

Globally, malaria takes a toll of some half a million people every year; the morbidity and mortality is quite high in sub-Africa region. Improved knowledge of malaria has brought in better treatment methods but a vaccine still remains a distant dream. The best options to stay off malaria are preventive. Use of nets, preferably insecticide-treated, spraying insecticide controlling water bodies to avert spread of mosquitoes needs to be adopted.

### **Health Event of the Month**

#### **World Breastfeeding Week: 1-7 August**

With a view to spread awareness about several advantages of breastfeeding, World Breastfeeding Week (WBW) is celebrated annually during 1-7 August, the world over, at the initiative of World Alliance for Breastfeeding Action (WABA). Breastfeeding is closely linked to each of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) for the overall well being of families and nations. Breastfeeding contributes to the survival, health and wellbeing of all.

Considering that over half a billion working women are deprived of essential maternity protection due to absence of relevant legislation in many countries; hardly 20 percent of countries require employers to provide employees with paid breaks and facilities for breastfeeding or expressing milk; less than half of infants under 6 months of age are exclusively breastfed in 2023, the theme of World Breastfeeding Week is: Enabling Breastfeeding: Making a Difference for Working Parents.

The WBW commemorates the Innocenti Declaration signed in August 1990 by government policy-makers, WHO, UNICEF and other organisations to protect, promote and support breastfeeding, which is the best way to provide infants with the nutrients they need.

Broadly, WABA attempts to: galvanise multi-dimensional support from all sectors to enable women everywhere to work and breastfeed; promote action supporting working women to continue breastfeeding; inform people about the latest in global maternity protection rights, and raise awareness of the need to strengthen related national legislation and its implementation; strengthen, facilitate and showcase practices that enable women working in the informal sector to breastfeed; liaise with target groups like trade unions, women's groups and youth organisations to protect the breastfeeding rights of women at work place.

## स्तनपान से मां को मिलने वाले फायदे

सदियों चली आ रही शिशुओं को स्तनपान प्रथा से बच्चे को जो अनेक स्वास्थ्य तथा अन्य लाभ मिलते हैं, परोक्ष लाभ परिवार को भी होते हैं, उनसे करीब सभी व्यक्ति परिचित हैं। यहां हम उन फायदों की चर्चा कर रहे हैं जो विशेषकर स्तनपान कराने वाली महिलाओं को प्राप्त होते हैं।

- 1. वजन कम करनाः स्तनपान कराती महिलाओं में दूध के निर्माण से मां का वजन स्वाभाविक तौर पर बढ़ता है, वे मोटी हो जाती हैं। दूध बनने में प्रतिदिन औसतन 450 कैलोरी खर्च होती है। दूध पिलाने वाली महिलाओं में गैरजरूरी अतिरिक्त फैट घटता है, कैलोरी कम हो जाती है और वजन को नियंत्रण में रहता है।
- 2. शरीर के बढ़े हुए आकार को शीघ्र सामान्य करता है: स्तनपान कराती महिलाओं में लैक्टेशन हार्मीन ऑक्सीटोसिन तथा प्रोलेक्टिन का स्नाव होता है। जहां ऑक्सीटोसिन बढ़े हुए आकार को पुनः सामान्य रूप में लाने में सहायक है वहीं प्रोलेक्टिन मां के अंग-प्रत्यंगों को सुकूल प्रदान करता है जिसकी उसे जरूरत रहती है।
- 3. घावों का जल्द भरनाः प्रसव के बाद मां के शरीर में अनेक स्थानों पर घाव व दर्द बना रहता है। लेकिन स्तनपान कराने की वजह से यह दर्द व घाव जल्दी से भर जाते हैं।
- 4. बेहतर नींदः हालांकि नवजात शिशु को हर 2-3 घंटे में भूख लगते रहती है किंतु रात को सोने से पहले स्तनपान से उसकी अधिक संतुष्टि होती है और वह ठीक से सोता है। फलस्वरूप मां की नींद में खलल की कम संभावना रहती है। यों स्तनपान में निहित प्रोटीनों में और अमीनो एसिड के अलावा मेलाटोनिन प्रोटीन नींद आने में मदद करता है।
- **5. बेहतर मानसिक व शारीरिक स्वास्थ्य:** स्तनपान कराने वाली माताएं बच्चे के अधिक शारीरिक सानिध्य में रहने से उनसे बेहतर और सशक्त रिश्ते बनाती हैं। ऐसी माताएं स्वयं मन-शरीर से अधिक स्वस्थ रहती हैं।
- 6. हार्मीन का संतुलन: स्तनपान कराती महिलाओं के हार्मान संतुलन में रहते हैं जिससे मां अधिक ऊर्जावान रहती है; उनमें प्रसवोत्तर रक्त स्राव कम पाया जाता है।
- 7. बीमारियों का कम खतराः विभिन्न अध्ययनों से सिद्ध हुआ है कि स्तनपान कराने वाली महिलाओं को स्तन कैंसर, डिम्ब ग्रंथि का कैंसर, ऑस्टियोपोरोसिस का कम जोखिम रहता है।
