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HEALTH EVENTS OF THE MONTH

Rheumatoid Arthritis Awareness Day: 2 February

Rheumatoid arthritis (RA) is the most common form of autoimmune inflammatory arthritis mistakenly attacking the joints, particularly the synovial membrane lining the joints. This attack leads to inflammation, tissue damage, and joint destruction. Its symptoms are joint pain, stiffness & inflammation, fatigue, fever, loss of appetite, muscle weakness and joint deformity.

RA Awareness Day, observed annually on **2 February** plays a crucial role in raising awareness about this debilitating disease that affects millions worldwide. This day was established by the Rheumatoid Patient Foundation in 2011. The day highlights the importance of early diagnosis, effective management, and ongoing research for a cure. The official theme for RA Awareness Day 2024 is, *Living Well with RA: Early Diagnosis, Effective Management, and a Brighter Future*. This theme centres around two key aspects of living well with RA: early diagnosis, effective management, which includes importance of adherence to treatment plans, healthy lifestyle changes, and eliciting support from healthcare professionals and communities.

As for treatment, medications like corticosteroids, nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs), and disease-modifying antirheumatic drugs (DMARDs) are administered to control inflammation and pain reduce inflammation. Physio therapy, occupational therapy, exercise and healthy diet are recommended to enhance functional abilities.

World Cancer Day: 4 February

Every year, the date **4 February**, the **World Cancer Day**, is a reminder to consider taking concrete action towards ameriorating the plight of people suffering from various cancers and how best to prevent its occurence. It is an opportunity to collectively examine cancer control and prevention strategies. Despite enormous researches underway, bottlenecks in detection, prevention and treatment of various cancers persist. The magnitude of this dreaded disease warrants comprehensive planning and concerted efforts towards evolving feasible ways to safeguard the populations. Till no definitive treatment is in the offing, prevention seems to be the best recourse. There is consensus among health experts that lifestyle modifications can contribute significantly in reducing the incidence of cancer.

Cancer refers to a group of diseases marked by the development of abnormal cells that proliferate exponentially and destroy normal body tissue. It can spread throughout the body. Its common symptoms are: Lump or thickening of an area under the skin; nexplained bleeding or bruising; fatigue; persistent cough or trouble breathing; weight changes, changes in bowel or bladder habits; skin changes, such as yellowing, darkening or redness of the skin, sores that won't heal, or changes to existing moles

Cancer takes the yearly toll of 10 million people (a figure more than HIV/AIDS, malaria and TB combined). Good news is, over a third of cancer cases can be prevented and another one third can be cured if detected timely and treated properly. The triennial 2022-24 theme of World Cancer Day, 'Close the Care Gap' therefore highlights that each sector and individual can make a difference, in whatsoever way, and that together we can make tangible progress in reducing the global impact of cancer. Today, more than half (65%) of cancer deaths are happening in the

least developed parts of the world. Even if you live in a higher income country, inequities still exist among lower-income, indigenous, immigrant, refugee and rural communities. Equitable access to cancer prevention, diagnosis, treatment and care can save lives.

International Epilepsy Day: 12 February

Epilepsy, a chronic non-communicable disease of the brain that can affect person of any age, is marked by seizures, loss of consciousness or awareness, disturbances of movement, sensation (including vision, hearing and taste), mood, or other cognitive functions. Those living with epilepsy are prone to fractures and bruising from injuries due to seizures, and higher rates of anxiety and depression; they have high rates of premature mortality; 80 percent of the 50 million people worldwide with epilepsy are in low- and middle-income countries and in rural areas. An estimated up to 70 percent people living with epilepsy could live seizure-free if properly diagnosed and treated. Three quarters of people with epilepsy, the oldest recorded disease, do not get the treatment they need. An estimated 25 percent of epilepsy cases are potentially preventable.

Fear, misunderstanding, discrimination and social stigma have surrounded epilepsy for centuries. This stigma continues in many countries today and can impact on the quality of life for people with the disease and their families. People with epilepsy may experience limited access to educational and career avenues, difficulty obtaining a driving license, barriers to join many occupations, and reduced access to health and life insurance.

Observed annually on 2nd Monday in February, **International Epilepsy Day** is an awareness-raising initiative to drive the implementation of the 10-year (2022-31) plan on epilepsy and other neurological disorders to close the major treatment and inclusion gaps for people with epilepsy worldwide. Low levels of health literacy versus the high levels of misunderstandings and misconceptions about epilepsy are major barriers to achieving the epilepsy-specific global targets. Global target by 2031 seeks increased service coverage for epilepsy by 50 percent.

National Science Day: 28 February

With a view to inculcate scientific spirit in our thoughts and actions, **National Science Day** in celebrated in India every year on **28 February**. This date was selected to commemorate the landmark achievements of Indian Scientist Sir Chandrasekhara Venkata Raman who in 1928 discovered a phenomenon of scattering of photons, later known as 'Raman Effect' after his name. Two years after this remarkable discovery in 1930, he was honoured with Nobel Prize for it; it was the first Nobel Prize for India in the field of science. Raman Effect is a phenomenon in spectroscopy discovered by the eminent physicist while working in the laboratory of the Indian Association for the Cultivation of Science, Kolkata.

National Science Day, celebrated as the main science festival, seeks to spread the message of importance of science and its application among the people through: display of national activities, efforts and achievements in the field of science for welfare of human being; discussion on the issues and implementation of new technologies for the development of the science; encouraging the people and popularising the Science and Technology. The theme for National Science Day 2024 is **Science for a Sustainable Future** that highlights the role of science & technology in addressing global challenges like climate change, resource depletion and environmental degradation.

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
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78th TNAI National Conference
