# **HEALTH EVENTS OF THE MONTH**

# International Women's Day: 8 March

Due to traditional bias and discrimination against female gender all around, women have remained behind on many fronts. The multiple crises of our age put immense pressure on communities in achieving gender equality. Ensuring rights of women and girls globally is the only way to secure prosperous and just economies, and a healthy planet for future generations. The International Women's Day (IWD) on 8 March is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women. The IWD also marks a call to action for accelerating women's equality.

According to a joint report of World Economic Forum & McKinsey Health Institute, although women may live longer than man on average, women spend 25 percent more of their life time in debilitating health conditions than do men. Further, closing the women's health gap can add USD one trillion to global economy by 2040. The report envisages economic growth of around \$3 for every \$1 invested on women's health. Women's health remains unfunded, deplores the report. This makes the aptness of IWD theme for 2024, **Invest in Women: Accelerate Progress.** 

The key identified areas requiring our concerted action to ensure women are: Investing in women: A human rights issue because investing in women is a human rights imperative and cornerstone for building inclusive societies and progress for women benefits us all; Ending poverty: as COVID pandemic and economic turmoil have pushed an extra 75 million people into severe poverty line, making immediate action crucial; Implementing gender-responsive financing since austerity negatively impacts women and crowds out public spending on essential public services and social protection; Shifting to a green economy and care society because a shift towards a green economy and care society amplifies women's voices, and; Supporting feminist change-makers that receive a meager 0.13 per cent of total official development assistance.

# World Kidney Day: 14 March

Kidney is a vital organ in human body regulating its various functions. Its primary fuction is removal of wastes from body by filtration, regulating electrolytes, maintains acid-base balance, regulating blood pressure and secretion of various hormones. Kidneys filter about 189 litres of fluid daily. About 99 percent of fluids of the unurinated fluid is reused. Malfunctioning of kidney due to any reason can destabilise the life of a person, most at risk are peoplewith diabetes or high BP.

A joint initiative of the International Society of Nephrology and the International Federation of Kidney Foundations, **World Kidney Day** on 14 March (initiated in 2006) is a global health awareness campaign focusing on the importance of the kidneys and reducing the frequency and impact of kidney disease and associated health problems, worldwide. The campaign theme announced for 2024 is, *Kidney Health for All* - Advancing Equitable Access to Care and Optimal Medication Practice. This day is celebrated yearly on the second Thursday of March in 100+countries.

If detected early, chronic kidney disorder (CKD), a condition impinging on many physiological parameters, is treatable. The activities of the campaign include: educating public on the role of kidney in maintenance of health and urging medical professionals of the important role they can play to in detecting problems encourage more systematic screening of patients.

In the last stage of chronic kidney disease, called end-stage renal disease (ESRD), the kidneys are just unable to remove enough wastes and unwanted excess fluids from the body. At this point, dialysis is often the only option with the patients, usually up to three times a week. If that too does not provide necessary relief, transplant, a costly proposition, turns out to be the only option. Increasing incidence of diabetes and hypertension is deemed to be a major cause triggering CKD. In India, prevalence of CKD is 800 per lakh population while that of ESRD is 155-200 per 10 lakh.

# World Tuberculosis Day: 24 March

There has been much advancements in control of the ages-old disease tuberculosis (TB), increased access to treatment, and availability of more accurate diagnostics, yet its elimination remains a challenge in many parts of the world. causing around 1.5 million deaths every year, mostly in developing countries.

Strains of tubercle mycobacteria mostly attack the lungs but can also affect other parts of the body. Tuberculosis can spread through the air when people who have an active TB infection cough, sneeze, or otherwise transmit their saliva through the air. If left untreated, it kills more than half of those so infected. Nearly 28.2 lakh people got TB in India in 2022, meaning one person gets TB every 11 seconds in India, according to the report in November 2023. India's contribution to the global burden is 27 percent, which is down one percentage point from the previous year's 28 percent. **World Tuberculosis Day** on **24 March** commemorates as tribute to Dr Robert Koch, who this day in 1882 surprised the scientific community by announcing about discovery of the cause of tuberculosis i.e. the TB bacillus. It is a day to build public awareness about the global epidemic of tuberculosis and efforts to eliminate the disease. Tribal people, slum dwellers, prisoners, cotton mill workers and persons with impaired immune systems are more vulnerable to the disease. The 2024 theme is continuation of earlier one i.e. "Yes! We Can End TB". TB is still one of the world's deadliest diseases and recent years have seen a worrying increase in drug-resistant TB by encouraging investment, abiding by latest WHO recommendations and seeking involvement of civil society organisations.

# Need to redesign healthcare for women

In an open letter signed by more than 40 partners in the newly launched Global Alliance for Women's Health, to call for action to redesign healthcare with women in mind, Paula Bellostas Muguerza, Senior Partner and Europe Co-Lead, Health at Kearney mentioned that:

"We do not understand female biology as well as we do that of men ... Endometriosis affects 10% of women of reproductive age, but doesn't see the level of investment or interest in finding a cure.

"At the heart of it is a societal problem because we are not prioritising the lives of women in the same way that we do those of men. And this then leads to not investing in it. When a woman enters the healthcare system, she is more likely to have her concerns dismissed, ignored or potentially missed altogether.

"We know what has to be done. We need to work on policy and advocacy. We need to redesign infrastructure for women-centric care. We need to make sure that capital is flowing into this. We need to rethink research and development, both in what we research, but also in how we research it.

"We need to close the data gap and then, finally, we need to reimagine medical education because we're still using 'reference man' as the basis for our medical schools. How about 'reference woman'?"

# आपके स्वास्थ्य से जुड़ा है मुंह की साफ-सफाई का मामला

मुंह की साफ—सफाई, मुस्कुराहट और सुंदर दांत आपके व्यक्तित्व का अभिन्न अंग हैं। मुंह अस्वस्थ होगा तो आपका समग्र स्वास्थ्य बिगड़ सकता है। नियम से मुंह की उचित सफाई न होने या इससे उत्पन्न बीमारी या अन्यथा दुर्गंध दूसरों को आपसे विमुख करने के अतिरिक्त आपका आत्मविश्वास डिगा सकती है। विश्व की 90 प्रतिशत जनसंख्या — करीब साढ़े तीन अरब व्यक्ति — मुंह की (ओरल) हाइजीन, ओरल डिसऑर्डर से जूझ रहे हैं। दिलचस्प यह है कि इनमें से अधिकांश को दुरस्त किया जा सकता है। मुंह के रखरखाव की कोताही से दांतों की सड़न और मसूड़ों की बीमारी से लेकर मुंह के कैंसर जैसी समस्याएं शामिल हैं।

ओरल हाइजीन में गड़बड़ी का सबसे सामान्य कारण खानपान की खराब आदतें हैं, जो दांतों को तेजी से क्षितग्रस्त करती है। दंत विशेषज्ञ बताते हैं, दांतों के बीच सहजता से फंस गई गंदगी को साफ करने के लिए ब्रश करना काफी नहीं रहता, इन्हें स्वस्थ रखने के लिए ब्रश की जगह पावर ब्रशिंग और धागे से दांत साफ करना (वाटर फ्लोसिंग) ज्यादा असरदार रहता है। सीडीसी की रिपोर्ट के अनुसार ओरल हाइजीन में लापरवाही के के चलते 57 प्रतिशत किशोरों में एक या अधिक दांतों में कैविटी होती है जिससे अनेक संक्रमण हो सकते हैं। मेयो क्लीनिक के अनुसार, मुंह की सड़न क्रॉनिक और गंभीर बीमारी के जोखिम को कई गुना बढ़ा सकती है, इनमें एचआईवी, डिमेंशिया, अल्जाइमर, डायबिटीज से लेकर कार्डियोवैस्कुलर, ऑस्टियोपोरोसिस और प्रजनन, जैसी बीमारियां शामिल हैं।

ओरल हाइजीन के प्रति सजग रहने की दृष्टि से वर्ल्ड डेंटल फेडरेशन (एफडीआई) 20 मार्च का दिन मुंह की साफ—सफाई दिवस (ओरल हैल्थ डे) बतौर मनाता है। विश्व के 200 से अधिक देशों में कार्यरत करीब दस लाख दंत विशेषज्ञ फेडरेशन से संबद्ध हैं। वर्ष 2024 का ओरल हैल्थ डे का थीम ''साफ सुथरा मुंह यानी उम्दा स्वास्थ्य'' मुंह के स्वास्थ्य को समग्र स्वास्थ्य का अभिन्न घटक मानने पर जोर देता है तथा मुंह, दांत और मसूढ़ों की सही साफ—सफाई के तरीके अपनाने की संस्तुति करता है।

दांतों की दुरस्ती के लिए ब्रश के साथ कदाचित पावर ब्रिशंग करना लाभकारी रहता है। यह कार्य बिजली के दुथब्रश से होता है, जो वाइब्रेशन के साथ दांतों पर गोल—गोल घूमते हैं और बारीकी से दांतों की सफाई करते हैं। इसके साथ ही, खासकर बच्चों को ब्रश करने का सही तरीका सिखाया जाना चाहिए ताकि इस प्रक्रिया में उनके मसूढ़े आहत न हों। मुंह की सफाई के लिए जीभ को साफ करना भी आदत बनाना अच्छा रहता है। कोई समस्या आने पर यथाशीघ्र दंत चिकित्सक से मशविरा लेना चाहिए। ध्यान रहे, दांत क्षीण होंगे या गिर जाएंगे तो आप खानपान के आनंद से भी वंचित हो जाएंगे।
